Kansas Department of Health and Environment

Lead-based Paint Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule excerpt:

- Training, certification, and work practice requirements: Firms are required to be licensed, their employees must be trained in use of lead-safe work practices, and lead-safe work practices that minimize occupants' exposure to lead hazards must be followed.
- What activities are subject to the RRP rule? In general, any activity that disturbs more than 6 square feet of paint interior and 20 square feet of paint exterior in pre-1978 housing and child-occupied facilities, including: remodeling and repair/maintenance, electrical work, plumbing, painting, carpentry, window replacement.

How does a Renovator become certified? Individuals that would like to become KDHE Certified Renovators must successfully complete a training course put on by a KDHE accredited training provider, then submit to KDHE the following:

1. A completed Certified Renovator Application/Renewal Form KS/100. This form can be delivered by mail, in person, or completed online at www.kshealthyhomes.org
2. Proof of any certifications as a Renovator in any other states or EPA region.
3. Training completion certificate from KDHE accredited training provider.
